Dean's Message for the Sixth Sunday of Easter 17.05.2020

# **Prayer resource for the Sixth Sunday of Easter**

Jesus' injunction to show him we love him by keeping his commandments is especially relevant in these difficult times. We give practical expression of our love for others by neighbourly acts of kindness, and equally by complying with constraints on our daily lives and cheerfully accepting disruption and inconvenience, and all for the greater good. Remembering that we are united in the Body of Christ, we pray for others, for ourselves, and for the world; we pray also for our Cathedral community.

'Truly God has listened; he has heeded the voice of my prayer. Blessed be God who did not reject my prayer nor withhold his love from me' *Ps* 66:19-20

In today's Gospel Jesus promises not to abandon the disciples to the difficult task he will set them. The Advocate, the Spirit of truth, which he will send to comfort and help them is his own spirit, his inner life; that Spirit will be with them always. The promise is to us too, to all who are joined to Jesus and the Father by an unbreakable bond of love.

Read the passage through slowly, two or three times, noting carefully anything that stands out for you.

## John 14: 15-21

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them."

Think about the words or phrases which particularly struck you.

- What does the continuing presence of Jesus' Spirit mean for you?
- How can we "see" him when the world can't?
- Consider the depth and the implication of Jesus' promise '..you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you'.

Gather your reflections into your own prayer of thanksgiving and praise.

Other readings for today are:

- Acts 17:22-31
- Psalm 66:8-20
- 1 Peter 3:13-22
- John 14:15-21

In conclusion pray the Collect for the sixth Sunday of Easter:

God who speaks in silence; help us wait in quietness. When you seem absent, grant us the faith that knows you are there, bringing to fulfilment all you have begun. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever. Amen
