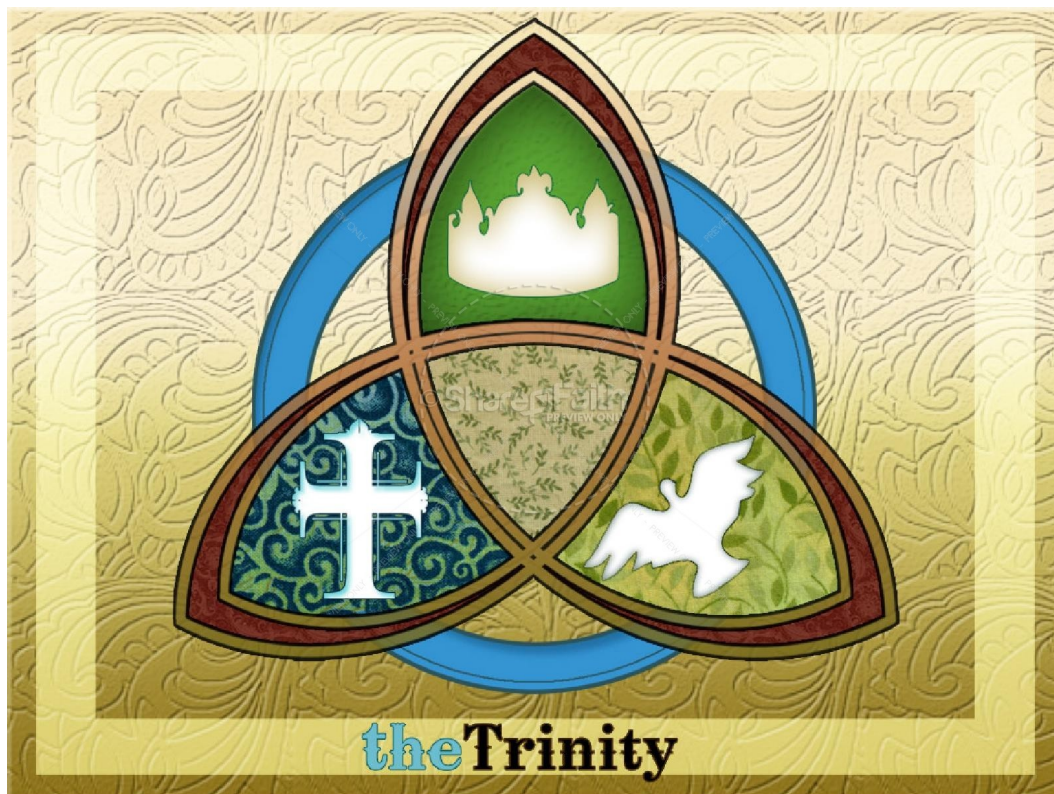

You may recall the work last year to oppose Skycity Hamilton's plan to swap 3 blackjack tables for 60 more pokie machines in their casino. Many of you and your churches were praying into this, aware of the additional harm that such a move would create. Well....

The outcome is in, the Gambling Commission has DECLINED the Skycity application!

This is a great victory for public health and for communities impacted by gambling-related harm!

A huge thanks to all the organisations that gathered together to oppose this application. Special thanks to Anglican Action Trust Board member David Wilson for taking up the legal challenge. And thanks to all of you who prayed.

Spiritual Reflection - Trinity Sunday

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This is a very familiar invocation and dedication to God of whatever we are doing, be it a service, a baptism, preaching a sermon, or any more mundane task. But it is at the same time a very deep mystery, which Trinity Sunday asks us to ponder, after following from Advent to Pentecost the important stages of Jesus' ministry. And while a mystery, it is a statement of how God has allowed His ineffable and invisible self to be made known to our very limited perceptions. God has been called the ground of our being, the essence of everything that we can experience, but particularly we know God through Emmanuel, God with us, in a human being, in the life of Jesus of Nazareth. Further, we experience His Spirit as continuing to act in ourselves and in the world.

The Bible, though time and time again revealing God to us in all these three 'Persons', names the Trinity only twice, once on today's Gospel (Matt 28:16-20), and once in St Paul's prayer for the Corinthians (2 Cor 13:13) in the well known words of 'The Grace'.

Read these words carefully and slowly two or three times:

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Think in quietness about what the grace, love, and fellowship of God mean to you. Pray that you may be made more and more aware of all these all-embracing aspects of God's revelation of Himself to us. Pray that they may guide and strengthen us in our service to God and to each other.

Let your prayer become wordless, as you move to wonder at the generosity of God in His care for us.

Other readings for today are:

- Gen 1:1-2:4a
- Psalm 8
- 2 Cor 13:11-13
- Matt 28:16-20

As a conclusion, pray the collect Trinity Sunday:

Blessed Trinity, we know you as a community of love. Grant us so to worship that we are transformed after your likeness; to be creative, caring, life enriching people. For you reign in the glory of the power that is love. In your Holy Name we pray.
Amen.

Father, you sent your Son to bring us truth and your Holy Spirit to make us holy; open our hearts to exalt you, open our lives to reveal you, our one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

The minister says

Happy are those whose sins are forgiven,
whose wrongs are pardoned.
I will confess my sins to the Lord,
I will not conceal my wrongdoings.

Silence

God forgives and heals us.
**We need your healing, merciful God:
give us true repentance.
Some sins are plain to us;
some escape us,
some we cannot face.
Forgive us;
set us free to hear your word to us;
set us free to serve you.**

The presiding priest says

God forgives you.
Forgive others;
forgive yourself.

Silence

Through Christ, God has put away your sin:
approach your God in peace.

THE READINGS *(please sit)*

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (13:11-13)

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you.

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.

Thanks be to God.

THE GOSPEL

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Matthew (28:16-20)

Praise and glory to God.

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

This is the Gospel of Christ.

It is right to offer thanks and praise.

It is right indeed, everliving God,
to give you thanks and praise through Christ your only Son.
You are the source of all life and goodness;
through your eternal Word
you have created all things from the beginning.
When we sinned and turned away
you called us back to yourself
and gave your Son to share our human nature.
He made the one perfect sacrifice for the sin of the world.
Therefore we proclaim your great and glorious name, saying,
Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might;
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.

On the night before he died, he took bread;
when he had given you thanks,
he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said:
Take, eat, this is my body
which is given for you;
do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup;
when he had given you thanks,
he gave it to them and said:
Drink this, all of you,
for this is my blood of the new covenant
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins;
do this as often as you drink it,
to remember me.

Therefore loving God,
recalling your great goodness to us in Christ,
we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life
and this cup of salvation.

Send your Holy Spirit
that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive
may be to us the body and blood of Christ,
and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power,
may be renewed for the service of your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before you
in earth and heaven,
we worship you, O God,
in songs of everlasting praise.

here and everywhere
now and forever.
Amen.**
